

when depicting himself. Freud returned to self-portraiture repeatedly over almost seven decades, creating a body of work that stands as one of the most sustained achievements of his career. With more than 40 works on canvas, paper and etching plates that span the 1940s to the early 21st century, this exhibition assembles a lifetime of self-portraits. They trace the evolution of Freud's technique and style: from his linear and graphic early works to the fleshier painterly style that became the hallmark of his later output. They also show a life's journey, from young boy to old man, in what was effectively an ongoing study of the process of aging and the changes it inflicted on his own physical form.

This exhibit charts the artistic development of the renowned British figurative painter through the unique lens of self-portraiture.
